School officials and coaches of athletic teams believe that students who are selected for the privilege of membership on teams and squads should conduct themselves as responsible representatives of the school. In order to assure this conduct, administrators, coaches and sponsors enforce an Athletic Code of Conduct. Furthermore, members of teams and organizations who fail to abide by the Athletic Code of Conduct are subject to disciplinary action. Members of teams and organizations must always serve as examples of high moral character and must demonstrate appropriate academic commitment which is expected from all students. As recognized representatives of their school, team members are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior during the season (activity) or out of season, in uniform or out of uniform, on campus or off campus.

Section A – Extracurricular Activities and Education

1. The La Porte Independent School District has as its primary goal the academic education of all students. Therefore, each coach or sponsor has the obligation to encourage students to achieve high academic standards. **No Pass No Play.**
2. All student use of tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, or possession or use of non-prescribed controlled substances or paraphernalia will not be tolerated, and the violator will be subject to disciplinary action.
3. We strongly disapprove of students staying home on school days to rest for events that day or night. The administration reserves the right to limit or prohibit participation of students in cases of non-attendance at school.
4. School officials are not expected to police off-campus, non-school activities unless the violation is brought to public attention, is sufficiently severe to bring discredit upon the organization, and is clearly proven before ensuing further action. Rule enforcement will be consistent and immediate.
5. Each coach or sponsor has the prerogative to establish additional rules pertaining to the activity supervised. These rules may include attendance at practices, contest, trips, etc. Rules set by the individual coach or sponsor must be in writing and approved by the Director of Athletics and communicated to the student participants *before* the activity/season begins.
6. Students suspended from school by the Principal's Office will not be allowed to participate in activities or athletics while they are on suspension. This includes when the activity falls on the last day of suspension. If a student is assigned in school suspension they can practice after the school day has ended. Students assigned to in school suspension cannot participate in a competition during the suspension unless the competition falls after the end of the school day on the last day of the in school suspension.
7. The Principal's Office and Athletic Director will be notified of all violations of the Athletic Code of Conduct and the consequences of the infraction. In addition to the penalties imposed by the Athletic Code of Conduct, such infractions will also be subject to appropriate District Code of Conduct policies.

Section B – Procedures

A student may be suspended from participation in any activity according to the following procedures:

1. Violations of the Athletic Code of Conduct are to be immediately reported to the coach or sponsor of the respective sport, who then reports the violation to the Head Coach, Athletic Director and Campus Principal.
2. The Head Coach/Sponsor of the respective activity contacts the student, parents, Athletic Director and Campus Principal to inform them of the violation and the procedures to be followed. If requested, a meeting is scheduled within 3 school days or prior to the next event. The meeting will include the Head Coach, Athletic Director, student, Coach/Sponsor and a parent or guardian if desired.
3. The Athletic Director, Campus Principal and the Coach or Sponsor will determine the course of action. The student and his/her parents are notified of the decision immediately.
4. Any student who violates the guidelines and/or does not satisfactorily complete the season or activity may not be eligible for any awards or special recognition given for participation in the activity. Furthermore, a student who holds an elected or appointed office or position (i.e., peer leader, team captain, and student organization officer) may be required to relinquish the said position upon violation of the guidelines.
5. Penalties will be applied in every area of athletic activity in which a student participates. Any offense constitutes a violation in all activities covered under the guidelines.

Section C – Guidelines of Action

Guidelines are for the school year and refer to infractions which occur in or out of season. Guidelines also apply during the entire calendar year when the student is actively engaged in a school-related activity on or off campus

ATHLETICS

Consequences for an infraction by athletes are determined by the following guidelines:

1st Offense

Out of Season – Minimum penalty – warning and probation.

In Season – Suspension from at least one contest.

2nd Offense

Out of Season – Suspension from at least one contest. Penalty will begin with the initial contest of his/her next athletic season.

In Season – Suspension from at least one-half of the season.

3^d Offense

In or Out of Season – Suspension from all athletics for the remainder of the school year.

These suspensions may carry over from season to season during a single school year. Each consequence may vary according to the severity of the violation.

Section D – Right of Appeal

A student and his/her parents may appeal a decision by writing a letter to the Athletic Director with copies to the principal, within three (3) days following the meeting. This letter should request a hearing with the Administrative Council at the school.

Within five (5) days after the letter is received, the Athletic Director will notify the parents and the participant of the time and place of the appeal hearing. The school's Administrative Council will hear both sides of the case and will take action which they consider to be in the best interests of the student and the school. During the time between the original decision and the hearing, the Principal has the authority to waive the action which has been taken.

Athletic Participation Agreement

Please read the information below carefully. If you have any questions about any material included in this document, or do not understand any portion of it, please consult with the coaching staff before signing at the bottom of the page. Dismissal from the team or disciplinary action will be taken for any of the following:

- Use of illegal drugs, tobacco, or alcohol;
- Use of profanity/obscene gestures;
- Involvement in gang related activities;
- Involvement in theft/defacement of property;
- Hazing of any kind. This includes mental, verbal, and physical acts, or failure to report such;
- Males wearing hair too long, too high, or having a hairstyle that is in any way a distraction, such as braids/ponytails or highlights/hair tinting. Length or style of hair should never conflict with equipment safety standards. (Example: football, softball, and baseball protective helmets or headgear).
- Failure to be clean-shaven at all times;
- Failure to cover tattoos/skin markings during district-sponsored activities.
- Wearing earrings or jewelry in athletics;
- Tardies and unexcused/excessive absences;
- Failure to report injuries or illnesses that occur during practices or games to the coach and athletic trainer.
- Failure to lock my locker before leaving for practices or games. I will turn in valuables (money, rings, watches, necklaces, etc.) to my coach each day. *Coaches and school district will not be responsible for lost or stolen items;*
- Disrespecting a coach, teacher, principal, or game official;
- Verbal abuse or unsportsmanlike conduct toward opposing players, coaches, and officials;
- Misconduct on the bus to/from games, practice, public places, or destruction of property at rival stadiums.

Being a member of the LPISD athletic team does not entitle an athlete to a college scholarship or post-season honors (all-district etc.).

All athletes will be team players. Dissention, dissatisfaction, etc. resulting from participation should be addressed/expressed to the head coach.

GENERAL INFORMATION

School coaches may not:

- Transport, register, or instruct students in grades 7-12 from their attendance zone in non-school baseball, basketball, football, soccer, softball, or volleyball camps (exception: school coaches may hold one 6-day camp in their school district for incoming 7th, 8th and 9th grade students),
- Give any instruction or schedule any practice for an individual or a team during the off-season except during the one in school day athletic period in baseball, basketball, football, soccer, softball, or volleyball.
- Schools and school booster clubs may not provide funds, fees, or transportation for non-school activities.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY RULES

According to UIL standards, students are eligible to represent their school in interscholastic activities if they:

- are not 19 years of age or older on or before September 1 of the current scholastic year. (See 504 handicapped exception.)
- have not graduated from high school.
- are enrolled by the sixth class day of the current school year or have been in attendance for fifteen calendar days immediately preceding a varsity contest.
- are full-time day students in a participant high school.
- initially enrolled in the ninth grade not more than four calendar years ago.
- are meeting academic standards required by state law.
- live with their parents inside the school district attendance zone their first year of attendance. (Parent residence applies to varsity athletic eligibility only.) When the parents do not reside inside the district attendance zone the student could be eligible if: the student has been in continuous attendance for at least one calendar year and has not enrolled at another school; no inducement is given to the student to attend the school (for example: students or their parents must pay their room and board when they do not live with a relative; students driving back into the district should pay their own transportation costs); and it is not a violation of local school or TEA policies for the student to continue attending the school. Students placed by the Texas Youth Commission are covered under Custodial Residence (see Section 442 of the *Constitution and Contest Rules*).
- have observed all provisions of the Awards Rule.
- have not represented a college in a contest.
- have not been recruited. (Does not apply to college recruiting as permitted by rule.)
- have not violated any provision of the summer camp rule. Incoming 10-12 grade students shall not attend a baseball, basketball, football, soccer, or volleyball camp in which a seventh through twelfth grade coach from their school district attendance zone, works with, instructs, transports or registers that student in the camp. Students who will be in grades 7, 8, and 9 may attend one baseball, one basketball, one football, one soccer, one softball, and one volleyball camp in which a coach from their school district attendance zone is employed, for no more than six consecutive days each summer in each type of sports camp. Baseball, Basketball, Football, Soccer, Softball, and Volleyball camps where school personnel work with their own students may be held in May, after the last day of school, June, July and August prior to the second Monday in August. If such camps are sponsored by school district personnel, they must be held within the boundaries of the school district and the superintendent or his designee shall approve the schedule of fees.
- have observed all provisions of the Athletic Amateur Rule. Students may not accept money or other valuable consideration (tangible or intangible property or service including anything that is usable, wearable, salable or consumable) for participating in any athletic sport during any part of the year. Athletes shall not allow their names to be used for the promotion of any product, plan or service. Students who inadvertently violate the amateur rule by accepting valuable consideration may regain athletic eligibility by returning the valuable consideration. If individuals return the valuable consideration within 30 days after they are informed of the rule violation, they regain their athletic eligibility when they return it. If they fail to return it within 30 days, they remain ineligible for one year from when they accepted it. During the period of time from when students receive valuable consideration until they return it, they are ineligible for varsity athletic competition in the sport in which the violation occurred. Minimum penalty for participating in a contest while ineligible is forfeiture of the contest.

**Parent and Student Agreement/Acknowledgement Form
Anabolic Steroid Use and Random Steroid Testing**
